CLUNES, 148 kilometers (92 miles) northwest of Melbourne, Australia. Population 850. Elevation 310 meters (1,017 feet). High Temperature 30-40 deg C (86-104 deg F) in late February. Low Temperature -1 deg C (30 deg F) in July.

How to get there: by air to Tullamarine Airport (Melbourne). VicRail train to Ballarat. VicRoad Coach to Clunes. Or by car approx 1-1/2 – 2 hours along the Western Highway.



COLOMA, 51 miles (82 kilometers) northeast of Sacramento, California. Population 175. Elevation 750 feet (229 meters). High Temperature 90-100 deg F (31-38 deg C) in July. Low Temperature 40-55 deg F (5-13 deg C) in February.

How to get there: by air to San Francisco, Amtrak to Sacramento, rental car to Coloma; or by air to Sacramento International Airport, rental car to Coloma.

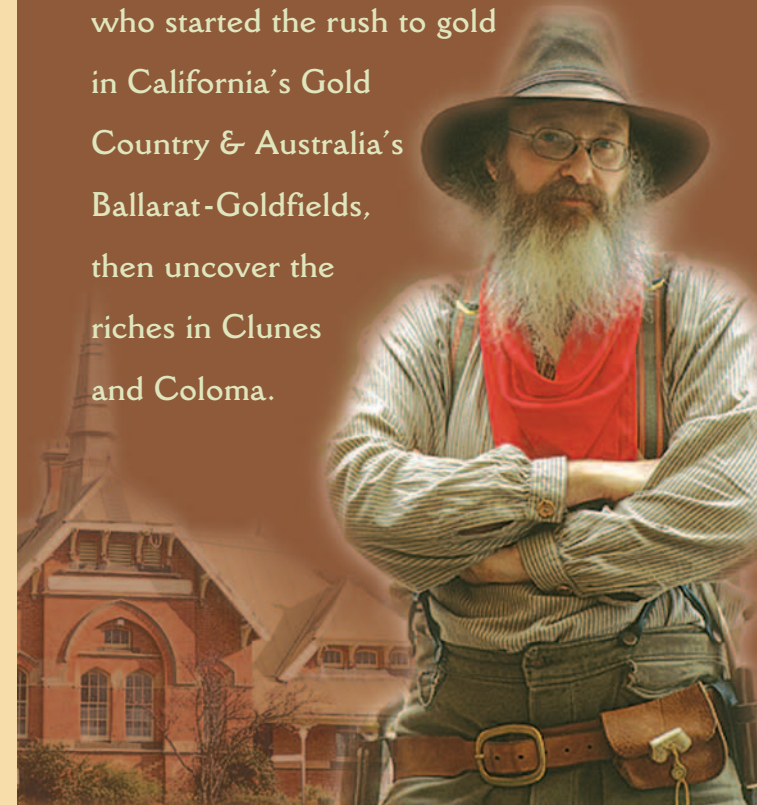

COLOMA, CALIFORNIA

Coloma lies in California's Sierra foothills, in the fabled "Gold Country." Through its center flows the South Fork of the American River, where gold was discovered in the tail-race of the saw mill being built by John Sutter and James Marshall in 1848.



Today, the small town of Coloma is home to Marshall Gold Discovery State Historic Park, where visitors come from around the world to see where California's Gold Rush began. There's a full-sized replica of Sutter's Mill, the Gold Discovery Museum, many Historic Houses to see, and so much more.

Don't miss live 19th-century trade demonstrations like blacksmithing and rope making. Then try your hand at gold panning, or take a hike on scenic hillside trails.

River adventures include some of the best whitewater rafting and kayaking in the West. There are also ranches, cafés, vineyards, bed & breakfasts, and campgrounds to enjoy. Isn't it time to see what the rush was all about?

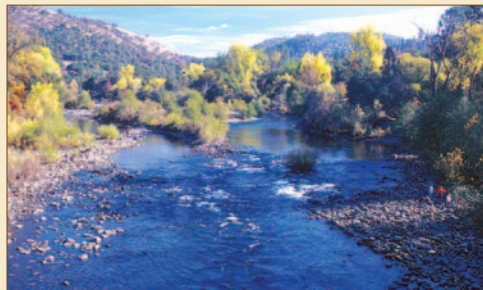
MOUNT BECKWORTH, VICTORIA, AUSTRALIA



IN 1848 JAMES MARSHALL FOUND THE GOLD NUGGET THAT WOULD RESULT IN THE LARGEST VOLUNTARY HUMAN MIGRATION IN HISTORY – THE CALIFORNIA GOLD RUSH.

OVER 8,000 MILES – 13,000 KILOMETERS – AWAY, IN 1851 IT WAS JAMES ESMOND WHO HIT PAY DIRT WHILE PROSPECTING A CLUNES QUARTZ REEF – LEADING TO THE RUSH TO CLUNES.

When settled in 1839, Clunes was the preserve of the Koori tribe of aboriginals. Today you can still see many fine 19th-century buildings – some of the best in the state of Victoria. Crafted in sandstone, bluestone, and brick, the historic buildings in Fraser Street reflect the elegance of the age.



After the history comes lots more – rock climbing, bushwalks, bird watching, and wine tasting. Nearby, at scenic reserves, you can see kangaroos, koalas, and wallabies. And if you are into bottles, Clunes is your kind of town. The Bottle Museum contains the largest collection in the southern hemisphere with more than 6,000, some dating back to the 1850s.

If it all looks a bit familiar, it may be because you've seen the town's streets and railway station in films and television shows from time to time. Now grab your camera, and join us in Clunes.
